SONETOR—current activities

The starting phase of the SONETOR project has been concluded. Partners have met and discussed the challenges, topics and goals throughout two international project meetings already. Valuable training materials for Cultural Mediators and the new Social Networking software are to be created soon.

At the moment the national partner organisations are conducting a research interviewing 20 experts and possible stakeholders in their region.

The primary goal of this query is to identify key competences future Cultural Mediators need to possess. The interview partners selected are mostly active

professionals working in the fields of education, health-care, migration or civil service. The research addresses people of all hierarchy levels.

The questions asked in these interviews aim at finding out what these people think is required by mediating professionals in the following areas: language, cultural background, social habits and integration, legal knowledge, work and employment, education and health-care.

Respondents are called to identify additional problem areas they sense to be important or relevant to the subject. The SONETOR partnership wants to find out what personal characteristics

and strengths experts expect from the group of people to be trained in the field of Cultural Mediation.

Once the results from this study are analysed, it is the task of the partners to sort the outcomes by knowledge, skills, competences to be acquired according to the European Qualification Framework (EQF).

The SONETOR project, as a European cooperation project in the Lifelong Learning Learning programme, is now concluding this crucial research and definition phase and will soon be able to proceed with the development of training materials for Cultural

The second international partner meeting

In May 2012, the partner organisations from Austria, Ireland, Spain, Poland and Greece met for a second time in Krakow, Poland to discuss the research and further development of SONETOR.

At this meeting a press

conference was held at which the public was informed about the goals and intentions of the project. The Polish spokeswoman of the Polish Ministry of Interior attended the meeting as a special guest.

Further dissemination events are presently being hosted by

all partners in their countries. Project posters and flyers are being distributed in all project partner countries and languages.

Within the next few weeks the national research results will be discussed by partners in Limerick, Ireland.
