Draft Job Profile

Describing the knowledge, skills and competences, a CULTURAL MEDIATOR might need to navigate migrant clients through different and sometimes difficult phases during their integration into their new host country. This can range from organizing spare time activities to responding to migrants' questions concerning governmental agencies and services or cultural differences between their country of origin and their new host country. The profile considers both, those with some experience of working in the role of cultural mediator as well as those who solely need to up-skill in specific topics.

Training content based on Peer Learning Scenarios

The project has developed multimedia training content for those working as Cultural Mediators and for those wishing to work in the field. The material offers peer learning based on situations migrants might encounter in everyday life pertaining to health care, education settings or when seeking assistance from other public services. The scenarios depict real working situations

from which learners will be able to assist migrants who are experiencing similar challenges. In addition to these unguided scenarios the platform also offers e-learning content which learners may pursue and receive a certificate of completion from the project. The social networking platform is the ideal virtual space where individual and social learning can be combined.
