What exactly are "Cultural Mediators"?

The project partners define it the following way: "Cultural Mediators are professionals who have been trained to facilitate the relations between migrants and citizens in the host country, aiming at the mutual exchange of knowledge and the establishment of positive relations between individuals of different cultural backgrounds and ethnic origins. The primary characteristics or skills of a Cultural Mediator main will include a good knowledge of the legislation, language, social structures such as health & education, as well as the culture and traditions of the host country and the migrants' country of origin. They will also ideally possess good communication and active listening skills, and experience of negotiating and problem solving."
